Tips to help guide you through the study process:

- You can find the Assigned Reading List and the Weekly Study Guides on the Website:
 - On your mobile device, go to the menu (3 horizontal lines) and Go to “A Year in the Bible.” Click on it.
 - On your laptop or computer, go to the bottom of any of the pages (Home, About, Give, etc.) and you will see a bar that includes, “A Year in the Bible” tab. Click on it.
- Stick to the assigned reading so that you do not fall behind.
- Choose a time set aside each day to study and make it a priority. If you miss that time, don’t let the day go by without studying.
- Try to make every Wednesday, but if you miss a Wednesday please stay on top of your reading and come back for the next Wednesday lesson.
- With time constraints during our Wednesday lessons, other scriptures will be given to you, but not read during the lesson. Those scriptures are references to understand assigned reading and you will need to read them during your study time.
- Read and study at home, jot down your questions and bring to our sessions on Wednesday. They may be answered during the lesson portion of our sessions, but if not please ask during our Q & A portion of our sessions.
- Know that the Bible isn’t necessarily in Chronological order... while the flow goes from Old Testament to New Testament, chapters especially in each testament often are not sequenced in chronological order, but to tell the story.

Week Five: June 1 – June 7, 2023

Exodus 35

1. True or False. The Lord commanded the whole community of Israel to work and do all their duties for seven days, but ensure they call the seventh day the Sabbath day and consider it to be holy.
2. True or False. Anyone who worked on the Sabbath day must be put to death.
3. True or False. The people of Israel couldn’t even light a fire in any of their homes on the Sabbath.
4. What were the items that the Lord asked to be taken up for Him as a sacred offering to be used in the Tabernacle?
5. What kind of heart did the Lord say would present those items/gifts to Him?
6. What items did the Lord command to for craftsmen to construct to go inside of the Tabernacle?
7. What kind of craftsmen did God say would construct those items?
8. In verses 20-22, who brought all the materials needed for the tabernacle?
9. Who did God choose specifically to be the lead craftsman and designer, and to teach their skills to others?

Exodus 36

1. Why did Moses have to stop the people from donating the materials to the Tabernacle?
2. What was the outermost covering of the tent covering made of?
3. Describe the inside of the Tabernacle curtain.
4. What type of wood was used for the framework of the Tabernacle?

3. What is another name for the Ark's cover?
4. Describe the Ark's cover?
5. What was 36 inches long, 18 inches wide, 27 inches high and overlaid with pure gold and a gold molding ran around its border?
6. How many lampstands were there? How many pounds of pure gold did the lampstands, lamps, lamp snuffers and trays weigh?
