Tips to help guide you through the study process:

- You can find the Assigned Reading List and the Weekly Study Guides on the Website:
 - On your mobile device, go to the menu (3 horizontal lines) and Go to "A Year in the Bible." Click on it.
 - On your laptop or computer, go to the bottom of any of the pages (Home, About, Give, etc.) and you will see a bar that includes, "A Year in the Bible" tab. Click on it.
- Stick to the assigned reading so that you do not fall behind.
- Choose a time set aside each day to study and make it a priority. If you miss that time, don't let the day go by without studying.
- Try to make every Wednesday, but if you miss a Wednesday please stay on top of your reading and come back for the next Wednesday lesson.
- With time constraints during our Wednesday lessons, other scriptures will be given to you, but not read during the lesson. Those scriptures are references to understand assigned reading and you will need to read them during your study time.
- Read and study at home, jot down your questions and bring to our sessions on Wednesday. They may be answered during the lesson portion of our sessions, but if not please ask during our Q & A portion of our sessions.
- Know that the Bible isn't necessarily in Chronological order... while the flow goes from Old Testament to New Testament, chapters especially in each testament often are not sequenced in chronological order, but to tell the story.

- 3. What kind of animals of the air could the people of Israel eat as instructed by God?
- 4. True or False. The people of Israel were permitted to eat insects.
- 5. Why did the Lord tell the people that they must be holy?

- 1. How many days after birth must a male child be circumcised?
- 2. How many days did it take for a woman to be ceremonially clean from the bleeding of childbirth of a male child?
- 3. How many days did it take for a woman to be ceremonially clean from the bleeding of childbirth of a male child?
- 4. Describe the sacrifice a woman must make after childbirth?

- 1. What kind of disease does Leviticus 13 address?
- 2. Who determined if a person was ceremonially clean or unclean?
